Earning 3 Additional Contact Hours

If a participant desires to earn 3 additional contact hours; the individual must complete, and return to PTS within 2 weeks of the course date, an analysis of eight case studies. Similar cases to the ones provided for home review will be discussed during the course. Case reports will be checked for content and completeness prior to granting the participant the additional 3 hours. Participants must complete all case studies and answer at least 80% of the content correctly to be awarded the three contact hours.

Course Description



This course emphasizes key considerations applicable to the physical and occupational therapist in effectively managing patients with chronic cardiopulmonary diseases along the spectrum of care from acute hospitalization to rehabilitation, home health and outpatient care. The course accentuates the current evidence on the interacting concepts of stability, decompensation and readmissions in patients with chronic diseases. Examination and evaluation strategies, organized clinical decision making and evidenced-based treatment techniques will be emphasized to provide clinicians with a contemporary best practice approach for managing patients with chronic cardiopulmonary diseases.

Objectives



1. Recognize three important radiographic characteristics in patients with heart failure and COPD.
2. Identify three examination techniques to determine the stability of a patient at rest and during activity in an effort to reduce readmissions.
3. Given the findings of an evaluation for a patient with chronic cardiopulmonary disease, the participant will integrate three common treatment activities into a treatment session.
4. Review the effects and uses of three categories of pharmacological interventions for patients with cardiovascular dysfunction.
5. Select and provide rationale for utilization of three examination techniques for patients with chronic cardiopulmonary disease in an effort to establish a PT/OT diagnosis and plan of care.
6. Identify and assess three appropriate functional outcome measures in the management of patients with chronic cardiopulmonary diseases.
7. Discuss three evidence based interventions for the management of patients with DVT/PE.

Course Faculty

Konrad J. Dias, PT, DPT, PhD, CCS is an energetic, animated and passionate educator. He utilizes technology and clinical examples to bridge the gap between evidence and practice. As an APTA Board Certified Cardiovascular and Pulmonary Clinical Specialist, Dr. Dias currently serves as Professor in the College of Health Professions at Maryville University, and Academic Director of the Cardiopulmonary Clinical Residency Program at the VA Medical Center in St. Louis, Missouri.

He has received grants to support practice facilitation, authored seven chapters in the most recent editions of several textbooks as well published articles and abstracts in the Journal of Cardiopulmonary Physical Therapy.
