

Emergency Room – Discharge cleaning after Severe Respiratory Precautions – November 3 at 1450

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Initials:	Steps:	Cleaning Procedure
	Step 1:	Perform hand hygiene with soap and water or alcohol hand sanitizer.
	Step 2:	Don an isolation gown. Tie at the top and the middle.
	Step 3:	Perform hand hygiene with soap and water or alcohol hand sanitizer.
	Step 4:	If an aerosolized procedure took place within the last hour before cleaning, an N95 mask should be worn and do not room next patient until an hour has passed.
	Step 5:	Perform hand hygiene with soap and water or alcohol hand sanitizer.
	Step 6:	Don face shield, goggles or approved COVID PPE from home.
	Step 7:	Perform hand hygiene with soap and water or alcohol hand sanitizer.
	Step 8:	Don gloves. The gloves must come over the gown cuffs.
	Step 9:	Cleaning Supplies <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Purple Sani Wipes or Substitute (Hydrogen peroxide, silver storage bag with wipes inside) or Quat solution Kill Times (must air dry) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sani Wipe -2 minutes • Quat solution – 10 minutes • HP and Bleach – Sani Substitute – 1 minute
	Step 10:	Disinfect all high touch point areas <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Stretcher mattress and railings • Door handles • Light switches • Counter surfaces • Sink handles • Overhead light handles • Monitor and Cables • Head wall • WOW • Cabinet Handles

	Step 11:	Dispose of all wipes.
	Step 12:	Remove your gloves using proper doffing methods.
	Step 13:	Perform hand hygiene with soap and water or alcohol hand sanitizer.
	Step 14:	Remove your gown being careful to only touch the strings.
	Step 15:	Perform hand hygiene with soap and water or alcohol hand sanitizer.
	Step 16:	Remove your face shield.
	Step 17:	Perform hand hygiene with soap and water or alcohol hand sanitizer.
	Step 18:	Staff should keep their mask on at all times or remain in their N95 Mask.
	Step 19:	Perform hand hygiene with soap and water or alcohol hand sanitizer.
	Step 20:	Remove gloves and sanitize hands.
